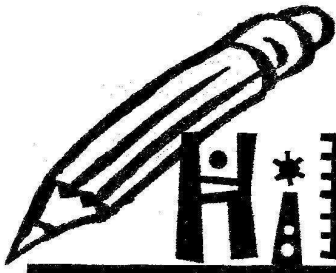

## A Note from Our Principal

The opening at Hilton Elementary School this year was very smooth! We conducted our New Family Orientation on August 18 for approximately 75 families. Also, we implemented a new pre-packaged school supply pick up where families could preorder school supplies in the spring and pick them up before school started. Nearly half of all Hilton families took advantage of this. We will most definitely offer this program again next year.

A big "Congratulations" to all the third grade students and teachers on achieving fine OAA test scores from last spring. 95.1% of all third graders scored proficient or above in reading and 91.2% scored proficient or above in math. This earned Hilton a performance index of 108.3.

Here are our enrollment numbers for academic year 2010-2011:

KINDER Three sections (two half day and one full day) = 65

GRADE 1 Four sections = 85

GRADE 2 Four sections = 86

GRADE 3 Three sections = 84

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**TOTAL = 320**

The biggest news at Hilton has been the brand new courtyard/outdoor classroom. This project received over \$9,000 in improvements and affords students the unique opportunity to study meteorology and science in a courtyard setting. The weather equipment installed is in memory of kindergarten student Colin Ryan who passed away last year after a lengthy illness. (He loved meteorology.)

This past month we had the Grand Opening for the Courtyard. It was truly spectacular! There were over 250 people in attendance. Children were able to explore Hilton's new courtyard as they made their way through gardens of India, China, Ireland, Africa and Ohio. It also features a waterfall and small pond. The Courtyard Open House culminated with Alligator Eric entertaining the children with his many animals. It should be noted that this courtyard was essentially completed by five Hilton families: Stanciu, Bazan, Urbanowicz, Flis and Singh. Also helping out considerably were some of our local cub scouts and boy scouts.

Hilton is in its second year of block scheduling. This affords teachers common planning and teaming time as well as longer uninterrupted instructional blocks. We are also working to try and implement school-wide WOW time. WOW stands for Wonderful Opportunities Weekly. Our intent is to use this time to intervene and differentiate for all students.

And finally, as I stated, this has been a very smooth opening for Hilton. The stars must be aligned for us as we've had absolutely beautiful weather and only one indoor recess so far!

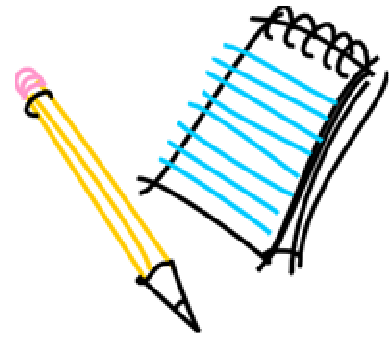

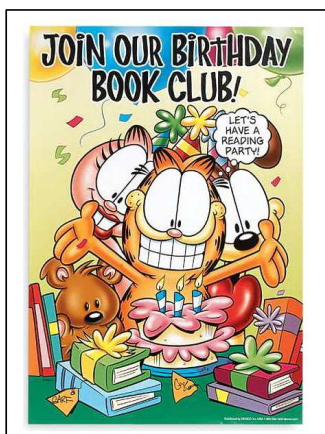

# Habitat News for September

With their help we freed the wetlands area from invasive goldenrod, deadheaded what seemed like millions of daisies, reined in overgrown plants, retrieved and spread soil from the compost bin, “weeded” lots of spearmint from the log pile (aka snake habitat), collected daylily and marigold seeds, collected and planted common milkweed seeds, cleaned out approximately half the bird houses, dug out and potted garlic chives and much, much more. And all of this was accomplished during the span of only three hours!

During the work party one house sparrow and two wren nests were found in the bird houses. We’re hoping to find evidence of other inhabitants when we clean out the rest of the bird houses in October. We also came across a woolly bear caterpillar (who successfully hid when we ran to get the camera), a wicked cool garden spider, several monarch butterflies and a teeny, tiny butterfly we will, hopefully, identify soon.

Some of the harvest was shared with PSO members at the September meeting. The Habitat Committee brought baskets of mint sprigs and goldrenrod flowers for attendees to take home and gave potted garlic chives, chameleon plant and lamb’s ear to Habitat volunteers.

Feel like you missed out on the fun? Well, you’ll have another chance to join us at our October Work Party (date TBD). Snacks/drinks will be provided and children are welcome. And don’t forget, the more volunteers available, the more opportunities the students will have to enjoy this amazing outdoor space.
